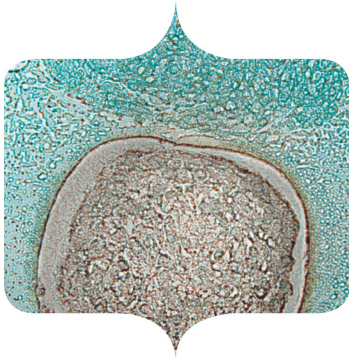


## 2017: INVESTING in *IN VITRO* SCIENCE
